



## Two Doctoral Students for a Project Cluster on Illegal Markets

Two positions are available from October 2011 in a research project concerning the sociology of illegal markets in the area of the Sociology of Markets led by Jens Beckert. One project will focus on illegality in art markets. The other project's focus remains open. Sociologists, criminologists, economists or graduates from the art sector are invited to apply.

The successful candidate will have completed his or her studies with distinction. Expertise – or a willingness to attain substantial knowledge – in the fields of economic sociology and illegal markets is also required.

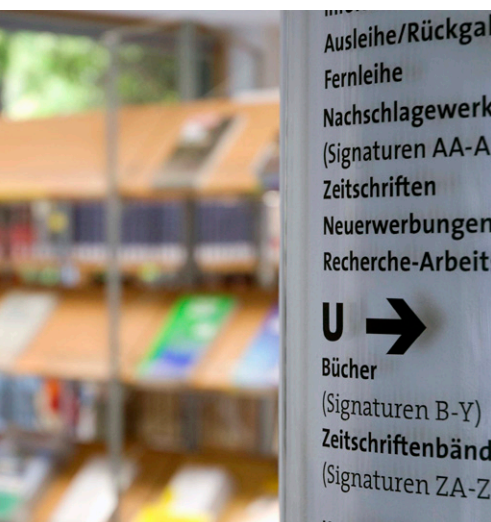
The positions are provisionally limited to one year and are remunerated at level 13/2 of the German civil service pay scale. Contracts may be extended following positive evaluation of the first project phase, with an opportunity for a three-year doctoral fellowship as a member of the *International Max Planck Research School on the Social and Political Constitution of the Economy (IMPRS-SPCE)*.
