



Call for applications to the comparative selection procedure for n. 1 collaboration contract on the EU funded project BETKONEXT

1. Premise

A comparative selection procedure, based on qualifications and possible interview, approved by Luiss CE, is organized to assign n. 1 collaboration contract – according to the National Collective Bargaining Agreement for Collaborators at Private Universities (ACNC) – for supporting research activities related to the project BETKONEXT (G.A. n. 101140537, CUP I83C24000260004), funded by the EU within the framework of the EUAF program (hereinafter "the project").

2. Subject of the contract

The project aims to explore thematic clusters for the protection of the EU's financial interests (FI) under the umbrella term "coordination". The work will include a comparative analysis of the EU Member States' anti-fraud legal framework and a comparative empirical research on the EU anti-fraud legal framework. The research activity will focus on EU fraud involving funds supporting the Criminal sector, taking into account Administrative law aspects as well. The resource will work in group with a senior resource on the project.

The purpose of this comparative evaluation selection procedure is to select 1 collaborator for carrying out the following research activities:

Position – Belgian case

- Support the organization of 1 seminar at the host university (KU Leuven) and support to the project's final conference.
- Contribution to at least one submission for an article/essay on a leading journal before the end of the project
- Actively collaborate to the research deliverables, for the Belgian part:
 - D2.2: Working Paper on cooperation and integration throughout common and comparable tools and procedures: critical issue and empirical evidences;
 - D3.2: Working Papers on new fraud schemes: cases and good practice;
 - D4.2: Working Papers on new fraud schemes: final recommendations.

3. Location, duration and remuneration

Project research activities to be carried out will belong to Luiss, under the supervision of the Scientific Coordinator of the project and the senior resource in charge for the national case-study, who will verify correct performance of the contract and the consistency between results achieved and objectives set.

Presence in Rome (Luiss campus) is not requested.

Below are the details regarding the duration and the remuneration provided for the profile:

Duration: from the first day of the month following the awarding of the contract, compatibly with the timing of administrative procedures, to the 28/02/2026.

Maximum gross amount depending on the fiscal regime of selected candidate: 12,142.86 euro.

The amount includes contributions to be paid by the researcher.

Any necessary travel expenses incurred by the selected people for the performance of the appointment during the term of contract will be reimbursed if duly authorised in advance in writing by the Scientific Coordinator and upon submission of appropriate supporting original documentation evidencing the expenses, in compliance with the University's internal regulations, national law and the relevant provisions of the Grant Agreement of reference.

The remuneration will be paid in deferred monthly instalments from project funds.

4. Admission requirements

Admission to the comparative selection procedure is allowed providing the following requirements, failing which the candidate will be excluded:

- a) four-year and/or master's degree in law, obtained from an Italian university or a foreign university in the EU;
- b) excellent knowledge of written and spoken English - indicate in the CV the level held, any certifications, and any publications in English;
- c) maximum age of 40 years.

In any case, for admission to the comparative evaluation selection procedure it is necessary that the candidates:

- d) hold Italian citizenship (Italians who do not belong to the Republic are treated as Italian citizens) or citizenship of one of the Member States of the European Union, or citizenship of a third country;
- e) enjoy of their civil and political rights;

- f) not have a criminal record and not be the addressee of measures concerning the application of preventive measures, civil decisions and administrative measures entered in the criminal records database;
- g) be aware that they are not undergoing criminal proceedings.

The following requirements will be positively evaluated:

- an academic title of PhD, obtained both in Italy and abroad, consistent with the objectives of the BETKONEXT project or a scientific-professional curriculum suitable for carrying out research activities;
- scientific publications;
- documentable research activity at public and private entities with contracts, scholarships or assignments, both in Italy and abroad;
- documentable scientific-professional curriculum suitable for conducting research activities;
- linguistic certificates (English and the relevant foreign language for the case study).

Candidates in possession of an academic qualification obtained outside Italy attach to the application the useful documents in order to allow the evaluation of their qualification, in compliance with the legislation in force in Italy and in the country where the title and international treaties or agreements were issued.

This comparative selection procedure is not open to those who, on the date of the deadline for the submission of applications, are related, by blood or marriage up to the fourth degree inclusive, to a professor affiliated with the department or unit responsible for this notice of competition, the Rector, the General Manager or a member of the Board of Directors of the University, pursuant to articles 18(1)(b) and 18(1)(c) of Law No. 240/2010 as amended.

The prescribed requirements must be fulfilled by the deadline set out herein for the submission of applications. In the absence of fulfilment of the prescribed requirements for admission or in the absence of a declaration of their fulfilment, the candidate will be excluded from the procedure.

Candidates are admitted conditionally. At any time and by means of a decision stating the reasons therefore, the Administration may exclude a candidate from the procedure for failure to fulfil the prescribed requirements.

5. Applications

without exception, no later than 3pm (CEST, UTC+1) on the **tenth day running from the day after the date of publication** of this call for applications. If the deadline falls on a public holiday, it will be extended to the first working day thereafter.

The following documentation must be attached to the application:

- 1) Curriculum vitae in English;
- 2) Copy of a valid identity document;
- 3) Four-year and/or master's degree certificate;
- 4) Relevant scientific publications;
- 5) Any other useful documentation and/or certification (e.g. Ph.D. documentation; linguistic certificates).

After the submission of the online application, including attached documents provided, candidates will receive a confirmation message at the e-mail address indicated. In case of non-receipt of the aforementioned email, contact the Research Office (06.8522.5989 - ricerca@luiss.it). Incomplete applications or applications sent and not received by the deadline will not be considered. Luiss declines all responsibility for non-receipt of applications deriving from any causes attributable to third parties, fortuitous events or force majeure.

Finally, it should be borne in mind that the Administration will check the truthfulness of the content of the declarations in lieu received and that, in addition to forfeiture of any benefits obtained on the basis of untrue declarations, the candidate could well be criminally liable for falsification of documents and making false statements.

The submission of an application to participate in this comparative selection procedure shall constitute full acceptance of the conditions set out herein.

Candidates with disabilities, within the meaning of article 3 of Law No. 104 of 5 February 1992, may apply in their application for the facilitations provided for in article 20 of the same law (additional time, special aids, etc.), attaching certification relating to the specific disability issued by the competent local medical commission.

6. Selection Criteria

The selection will be based on qualifications and a possible interview and carried out by a specially appointed Evaluation Committee.

Admission to the possible interview will be established by the Committee after verification of fulfilment of the admission requirements as deduced from the curriculum and documentation submitted by the candidates.

The overall final score -up to a maximum of 40 points- will be given by the sum of:

- the score achieved for qualifications – 30 points
- the score achieved in the possible interview – 10 points

The minimum score to attain eligibility is 24 points (or 18 points, if no interview is carried out).

Commission evaluation is final and unappealable.

7. Evaluation Committee

The Evaluation Committee will be appointed after the expiring date of applications submission deadline with a specific Luiss Rector's decree.

The Evaluation Committee shall be composed of:

- the Scientific Coordinator of the project;
- a project team component;
- an external member;

Every member of the Evaluation Committee can appoint a substitute.

One of the members of the Evaluation Committee will be entrusted with the task of recording secretary.

8. Evaluation Outcome

The outcome of the comparative selection procedure and the final ranking are published on the Luiss website at <https://www.luiss.edu/research/recruiting-calls> , as well as the list of candidates called to a possible interview and the timetable and the method/location of the interview. In case of, interviews can be conducted remotely, in person face-to-face at a designated location or electronically through a suitable application.

Finally, the Committee formulates an overall judgement for each candidate and compiles a ranking in descending order based on the sum of the scores obtained. The above ranking will remain valid until the end date of the project for needs directly related to the project and its implementation. In the event of a tie as regards the scores obtained, the youngest candidate shall be afforded precedence. Publication shall be deemed to constitute notification to all intents and purposes.

The winning candidates will be notified in writing of the offer of a contract at the ordinary e-mail address provided when submitting the application. The position must be accepted within 7 days after date of receipt of the offer, failing which the contract will be forfeited.

If the winner is a foreign candidate, he or she will have to meet all applicable labour law requirements for foreign nationals at the time of signing the contract. The contract is individual and indivisible. The contract shall conclude and the associated relationship shall cease on expiry of the term and shall not be tacitly renewable.

9. Publication

10. Processing of personal data

Pursuant to article 13 of Legislative Decree No. 196/2003 (hereinafter the "Data Protection Code") and article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (hereinafter "GDPR 2016/679") on the protection of persons and others with regard to the processing of personal data, the personal data provided by candidates will be processed in compliance with the above mentioned legislation and confidentiality obligations.

The data will be collected by Luiss Libera Università Internazionale degli Studi Sociali Guido Carli, with registered office at Viale Pola 12 in Rome, the controller with regard to the data in question, and processed for the purposes of managing this comparative evaluation selection procedure and the awarding of the collaboration contract, if any, for academic research and dissemination of results.

11. Disputes

The Courts of Rome shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any disputes that may arise in relation to the interpretation and performance of this call for applications.
