



Call for Applications: Double Degree (DD) Programs for Students and Graduates starting the Master's degree in the a. y. 2026/2027

This call is open to:

- Students enrolled in the final year of the Bachelor's degree during the academic year 2025/2026
- Applicants who have already obtained a Bachelor's degree

Applications can be submitted from **2nd to 16th March 2026** by **4pm (CET)**.

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All Double Degree candidates are required to comply with the selection procedures, deadlines and requirements indicated in the relevant Call for Application published in the [Luiss Master's degree Admissions 2026/2027 website](#). Please ensure to identify the specific admission procedures and deadlines that apply to your status as an applicant, such as EU or Extra-EU nationality/Luiss student.

In case of admission, to be eligible for the Double Degrees, all students are required to comply with enrolment regulations and deadlines set by each Call for Applications including those related to the registration to the Luiss Master's degree.

Admission procedures for a Luiss Master's degree and the selection procedure for Double Degrees Programs are separate, and students are required to follow regulations for both selection procedures. Admission to Luiss Master's degrees does not automatically imply a positive outcome in the selection procedure for a Double Degree; vice versa, the positive outcome of the Double Degree selection does not automatically entail a positive outcome in the admission process for the Luiss Master's programs.

Students who are selected for the Double Degree of their choice but are not admitted to the Master's degree will be excluded from the Double Degree. As per Luiss regulations, please be reminded that students admitted and registered to Luiss Master's degree programs are entitled to a refund only in the case they are not awarded with a Bachelor's degree by the deadline of 9 November 2026.

1. General Rules

Selected students will have the possibility to attend courses at the partner university during the mobility and have the credits recognized on their Luiss career at the end of the experience abroad. If compliant with both universities' rules and conditions, in terms of credits, attendance, deadlines, academic integrity, etc., participating students will be awarded with two degrees, which will be issued according to each university's deadlines and requirements. During the mobility, students will be subject to the rules of the partner university.

Selected students will spend abroad the 1st or the 2nd year of the Master's degree during the a. y. 2026/2027 or 2027/2028, depending on the mobility structure of the chosen program and will remain registered at Luiss during their stay at the partner university. They will not be required to pay additional tuition fees at the partner university, but they will continue paying fees to Luiss.

All expenses related to the participation in the program, notably transport, accommodation and food, administrative expenses, costs associated with securing a visa, medical/health/accident insurance, books, application fees or deposits, and personal expenses, will be borne by students. Furthermore, students must comply with all the regulations of both universities (sending and receiving) in order to obtain the two degrees.

Students selected for the Double Degree programs are required to follow the study plan which corresponds to the student's mobility year. The study plan will be provided in due course by International Degree Programs. Please note that study plans are reviewed periodically, and changes might occur to reflect the academic offering of both universities.

Selected students are required to read and understand the study plan and the rules related to the applicable mobility year. These are to be considered binding to the successful completion of the double degree program. Once selected, students are required to carefully read and sign the document "General Understanding on Mobility: Double Degrees and Structured Exchanges", which will be provided in due course by International Degree Programs.

All exams passed at the partner university during the mobility period will be transferred to the Luiss career according to the relevant study plan for each DD.

While every effort will be made to provide students with complete, accurate and timely information, Luiss reserves the right to change, amend, modify or revoke the programs. Luiss is not responsible for any cancellation or modification due to events beyond its control. If a program is cancelled or modified for these reasons, Luiss will inform all interested students in a timely manner.



2. Application requirements

Eligible students are allowed to apply to all DD Programs included in this Call for Applications.

Students will be able to participate in the selection only if they comply with the requirements listed in the summary in point 2.5 (“Summary of requirements by program”), if they register within the [prescribed timeframes](#) set by the Admission and Student Office, and have no pending administrative issues with Luiss.

The following requirements are valid **for all DD programs** in this Call:

- You should comply with the deadlines and the mandatory requirements for enrolment in the relevant Luiss Master’s degree and Major (where and as applicable); for details refer to table 1; All students are invited to check out this [link](#);

For all the DD programs included in this Call for Applications (except for the International Business and Business Transformation Programs with Paris Dauphine), the following condition applies:

- Students enrolled in the final year of the Bachelor’s degree in the a.y. 2025/2026 must graduate by the Summer Graduation Session of the a.y. 2025/2026 (July 2026).

2.1. Mandatory Major

To take part in the DD, selected students are required to choose specific tracks and majors, according to the rules for the completion of the study plan. More info on the study plan will be available at this [link](#) closer to time. The choice of the major takes place in the terms and deadlines established by the Luiss Admission Office and Student Office at Luiss. The relevant majors and tracks accepted for the DDs in this call are listed in table 1 of this document.

2.2. Weighted Average Grade

For external applicants:

If you are an external applicant, we will consider the data available on the Transcript of Records that you have submitted with your application. If you expect a change in the average of your grades and credits due to pending registration of exams (e.g. registration of exams taken abroad), you are allowed to re-submit an updated transcript of records indicating the average grade by 7th April at 11am, provided you notify us via email during the submission stage of your application that you have pending grades.

For Luiss applicants:

The weighted average grade considered for your application will be the one available to the Student Office by 7th April at 11am.



2.3. Admission to Luiss Master's Programs via GMAT/GRE or admission test

If you are planning to apply to the Luiss Master's in Management, Finance or Strategic Management via submission of GRE/GMAT certificates, you are required to include these certificates in your DD application, as an attachment. Applicants who fail to include these certificates will be automatically excluded from the present Call for Applications.

If you are planning to apply to the Luiss Master's in Strategic Management via admission test, you are required to include proof of your registration to the test as an attachment to your application. Applicants who fail to include the registration proof will be automatically excluded from the present Call for Applications.

2.4. Credits

All students are required to have registered at least 136 credits by application deadline. Applications including between 126 and 136 might be accepted, subject to slots availability and at discretion of the academic commission.

For students who took part in an international mobility program during the 1st semester of the a. y. 2025/2026 whose grades have not yet been registered into the student career, we will consider the number of credits obtained during the 1st semester of mobility. For further details on the documents that will be accepted for this purpose, please check section 4.4.4.

2.5. Language Requirements

2.5.1. English Language

The English-language certificates listed in the point 2.5 ("Summary of requirements by program") should not be older than two years from the application deadline (16th March 2026), meaning that only certificates issued on or after 16th March 2024 will be accepted.

If you are a Luiss student and you do not have an English language level issued by the Luiss Language Center (CLA) and do not hold one of the requested certificates, you have the possibility to take an ad hoc test at the Trinity School (Accademia Linguistica, Via dei Mille, 35) by 12 March 2026. To register, please send an email to CLA (cla@luiss.it), cc'ing International Degree Programs (international@luiss.it) no later than 4 March 2026, by 1:00pm. During the test the use of dictionary or other translation tools is not permitted. This option is available to Luiss students only.

During the registration process, students might opt for taking the test either in person at the Trinity School or online on the dedicated platform, with a final Skype interview for the oral assessment. Thus, students who have not a Skype account yet, are invited to create it in advance. For further information about the test and the language level as stated by Luiss please contact the CLA at cla@luiss.it.



Students not eligible to take the ad hoc test mentioned above but interested in submitting a certificate issued by the Trinity School are allowed to do so but must note that this is a fee-paying assessment test, which shall be reserved autonomously by the student. The test can be taken at any moment before the application deadline. The test is available also for students holding other language certificates and/or a CLA language level.

2.5.2. French language for Business Transformation and International Business Programs with Paris Dauphine University

For the Business Transformation and International Business Programs with Paris Dauphine University the French language should be equal to or above the B2 level (CEFR framework) ahead of the mobility year (by July 2027). For both programs the language certificate must be obtained and submitted to International Degree Programs by July 2027, at the end of your first year in Luiss, ahead of the mobility year (see point 2.5 “Summary of requirements by program”). All official language certificates are accepted, including the one released by the Luiss Language Center (CLA), as long as the level of proficiency (please refer to CEFR framework) is clearly stated on them.

The certificate you present must not be older than 2 years prior to your departure, so has to be issued after 1 September 2025. If you already have a valid French language certificate, you are welcome to include it in the application for the programs in this Call. Please note that it is mandatory for selected applicants to choose French as mandatory foreign language during the first year of the Master’s in Luiss.

3. Specific Program Rules

3.1. DDIM with Fudan School of Management

Students with Chinese nationality are required to apply directly through Fudan University.

3.2. DD in Finance with Paris Dauphine University

Applicants must have completed an undergraduate degree or be enrolled in an undergraduate program in the field of, Economics, Finance or Management.

Students with French education or background are encouraged to apply to the Double Degree through Paris Dauphine University. Their applications will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis by Paris Dauphine and Luiss.

3.3. DD in Business Transformation and in International Business with Paris Dauphine University

3.3.1 The Apprenticeship Track at Paris Dauphine

During the mobility period, students will be enrolled in the Apprenticeship Track (also called “Alternance”). As such, students will combine courses at the partner university with work in a company. Apprenticeship is compulsory to obtain the Master’s degree issued by Paris Dauphine University and, even though Paris Dauphine University will provide substantial support in the search, students are the sole responsible to secure an apprenticeship position. Selection procedures are autonomously conducted by the firms and both universities are not to be held responsible for failure to be hired for an apprenticeship or failure to complete the apprenticeship experience (alternance). In such a case, selected students will be subsequently removed from the DD with Paris Dauphine University and will spend their 2nd year of the Master’s degree at Luiss, obtaining thus only the Luiss Master’s degree in Management.

3.3.2 Professional experience (including internship) and relevant certifications

As you can see above, in Paris you will work in a firm, which means that having already some work experience under your belt could be extremely useful to find a job position. For this reason, we require a certificate before your mobility, as proof that you already have some working experience. The professional experience, which includes internships, may have been completed also before the Master’s degree and must be certified and relevant to the study plan of the chosen program. For more info on this, contact International Degree Programs (international@luiss.it).

You can combine different work experiences (ex. 3 months at Company X + 3 months at Company Y) but it’s important that your professional experience is done in a business environment and is in line with the academic profile of the program you are choosing. The company where you will do your internship must state the duration of your internship and the role you had.

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International Degree Programs will request this certificate at the end of your year I in Luiss, ahead of your departure abroad in September 2027.

3.3.3 Your graduation at Luiss

Due to the apprenticeship calendar, students taking part in these programs will not be able to graduate in the first available Luiss graduation session (July 2028) and will be able to do so in the Luiss Autumn session (October/November 2028) or in the extraordinary session (March/April 2029), if they wish.

3.3.4 Selection results

The selection results for these programs are considered provisional until selected students:

- Complete all academic activities included in the study plan for the 1st year of the Master's degree, before the end of the Summer exam session of the a. y. 2026/2027.
- Participate in the placement event organized by Paris Dauphine University in May or June 2027. This event could be online or in person. Date and attendance mode will be shared with students in due time by the team at Paris Dauphine University.
- Write and submit a preparatory thesis (called "Memoire"); this task will be completed under the supervision of a Luiss professor. The task will take place in the time between February 2027 and April 2028. Further information will be provided by International Degree Programs during the induction activities offered in September 2026.
- Achieve the requirements regarding the French language and professional experience (internship) mentioned in the relevant sections of this Call.

3.3.5 Students with French education or background

Students with French education or background are encouraged to apply to the Double Degree through Paris Dauphine University. Their applications will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis by Paris Dauphine University and Luiss.

3.4. DD in Management with the University of Mannheim

Applicants must have completed an undergraduate degree or be enrolled in an undergraduate program in the field of Business, Economics, Management, Finance, or Marketing as candidates are expected to have covered at least 36 ECTS in Business Administration Courses.

Applicants are required to enroll in Luiss in the Orientamento Eng of the Strategic Management Master's and subsequently choose its tracks in English.

During the program, students will be required to pay an administrative fee to the University of Mannheim for each semester of the program. For reference: this administrative fee amounted to €110,30 in the academic year 2025/2026, to be paid for each semester of the program.

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4. Application Procedure

Applications can be submitted from **2nd March to 16th March 2026** by 4:00pm (CET).

If you are a Luiss student: to apply, complete the online application form and upload the required attachments in the **web self-service** area of the Luiss website.

If you are a graduate or an external student, you can apply via the following **online form**:

The required attachments should be emailed as a single pdf file to International Degree Programs at international@luiss.it. For questions about the documents to attach to your application, contact International Degree Programs (international@luiss.it) before the application deadline.

Applicants are encouraged to apply well in advance of the application deadline and to double check the data entered in the application. If an error has occurred in the ranking of the preferences, applicants are required to flag it as soon as possible via email to the International Degree Programs and in any case no later than 17th March 2026. Please note that the request will be reviewed and evaluated, and as a result, approval is not guaranteed. Otherwise, the specified ranking of preferences will be considered binding.

Students that require compensatory tools or dispensatory measures during the mobility are invited to get in contact with the International Degree Programs (international@luiss.it) before applying, in order to get more information on the special provisions guaranteed in the selected destinations.

Only applications including all required documents and received by the application deadline will be considered.

International Degree Programs reserves the right to request further details or documents to applicants.

4.1. Compatibility among the DD Programs of this Call for Applications

Eligible students are allowed to apply to all DD Programs included in this Call for Applications. Applicants can apply to all programs; however it is not mandatory to apply for all available options. We encourage applicants to apply only for the programs they have a real interest in and for which all requirements are met.

Applicants will be required to rank the programs according to their preferences during the application process. Please note that this preference is strictly binding and can only be changed as specified in Section 4.



Students will be selected for only one DD within their list of preferences and will be removed from the selection procedures of the other DD programs, including the waiting lists. Therefore, students are strongly encouraged to select and rank only DD programs that they are genuinely interested in.

Students who are not selected for any DD can remain in the waiting list of more than one DD. If they are recalled from the waiting list of any program (regardless of their preference) and they confirm their participation, they will be subsequently removed from the other waiting lists.

Refusal or missing confirmation of the DD selection implies the official withdrawal from all the DD programs in this call. Applicants failing to comply with Luiss Admission procedures and deadlines will be excluded from the DD Program.

4.2. Compatibility with the QTEM Program, other DD Programs, International Student Exchange Programs and ENGAGE.EU

Selected students for a DD program in this Call for Applications are not allowed to apply to the QTEM Program, other DD programs open to students enrolled in the 1st year of the Master's degree or the International Student Exchange program during the a.y 2026/2027.

Students or graduates who have been selected for the QTEM Program for the mobility 2026/2027 are not allowed to apply to this Call for Applications.

The double degree programs might be incompatible with some ENGAGE.EU mobility programs. Students interested in both programs are urged to check academic calendars accordingly and ask the ENGAGE office for confirmation (engage.eu@luiss.it).

4.3. Attachments required in the Application Process

You are required to follow the "Application Instructions" uploaded in the "Useful Documents" section of the webpage of each program.

To be valid, the attachments must be in English and in PDF, readable, scanned (not photographed), named as follows:

The system does not read documents in a format that's different from pdf file.

4.4. List of Attachments

4.4.1. Mandatory Attachments for all Programs

1. For **students**:
 - Mandatory for everyone: latest transcript of records. This should include the weighted average grade, credits and grades obtained;
 - o from Luiss students we will accept the self-declaration printed from the University web self-service.
 - Only if applicable to you - GMAT or GRE certificate as explained in section 2.3
 - Only if applicable to you - Proof of registration to admission test as explained in section 2.3
2. For **graduates**:
 - transcript of records: this should include the final grade obtained for your Bachelor's degree, the weighted average grade and the list of exams covered during your BA.
 - Only if applicable to you - GMAT or GRE certificate as explained in section 2.3
 - Only if applicable to you - Proof of registration to admission test as explained in section 2.3
3. Mandatory for everyone: English Language Certificate. If the certificate is issued by Luiss, please attach the self-declaration form, which can be downloaded from Web Self Service.
4. Mandatory for everyone: Curriculum Vitae in English.
5. Mandatory for everyone: ID Card.
6. Mandatory for everyone: One motivation letter in English explaining your reasons for pursuing a Double Degree program. The letter needs to be uploaded on Web Self Service as a single PDF file.

The letter should include:

 - your personal reasons for applying
 - the academic reasons that make you a good fit for the program
 - examples of soft skills that make you a suitable candidate (e.g., real life examples of proactivity, adaptability, problem solving skills).

The letter should be approx. 500 words.

Applicants only need to submit one letter for all the programs they are applying to, so there is no need to upload a separate letter for each individual program of interest.

4.4.2. Mandatory Attachments only for Fudan School of Management

1. Passport: the document should be submitted by the application deadline. Students who do not have a passport or whose passport is due to expire in 2026 are required to apply for a new passport and share a valid copy with International Degree Programs (international@luiss.it) no later than 31st May 2026.
2. One academic reference letter from a University Professor that has taught you or with whom you have worked to some degree.



4.4.3. Optional Attachments

1. French language certificate, for International Business and Business Transformation Programs with Paris Dauphine University (if available at this stage).
2. Internship certificates relevant to your chosen program (if available).
3. Reference letters from past supervisors (could be academic or professional references).

4.4.4 For Students in International Mobility during the 1st Semester

Students taking part in an international mobility program during the 1st semester of the a. y. 2025/2026, whose grades have not been registered into their student careers, are required to submit the following documents:

- The Learning Agreement, which should have been provided to you by the International Office of your University (e.g. Erasmus office) – if not available, please request it ahead of the deadline.
- An official transcript of records of the exams taken abroad; if this document is not available to you during the application stage, we will accept a screenshot of the exams passed abroad.

These documents will only be used for this selection process. For the formal recognition of credits and grades into the Luiss student career, please refer to the relevant procedure of the International Student Mobility Office.

5. Selection Procedure

5.1. Selection Procedure for DDIM with Fudan School of Management and DD in Finance with Paris Dauphine University

Students will be selected by an Academic Commission on the basis of a non-disputable evaluation. The selection of the candidates will follow a 2-step process.

Step 1

The eligible candidates will be ranked after the assessment of their academic performance. This is calculated based on the weighted average grade and the English language proficiency, respectively weighting 60% and 40%.

The Academic Commission will rank eligible candidates and invite shortlisted candidates to interview. Please note that it is mandatory to confirm via email the attendance to the interview. Applicants who fail



to do so can be excluded from the interview. For Luiss students, we will use the Luiss email addresses for any communication.

The English language proficiency will be assessed according to the following table:

5.1.1 Bachelor's degree and International Secondary School Diploma

To be assigned the corresponding English language level, applicants are required to attach an official certificate explicitly stating that the language of instruction and examination is English. If you are a Luiss student, self-certifications are accepted. Diplomas from International Secondary Schools or Universities that certify courses taken in a bilingual format will not be accepted.

Step 2

This involves an in-person interview, held in the Luiss Campus (Viale Romania, 32 – 00197 Roma). For applicants who, for valid reasons (e.g. health reasons), cannot attend, we will consider the option of an online interview. The interview dates are included in the below Table 5. Interview invites will be sent out ahead of the interview date to include the exact meeting room. The interview will be in English; the panel will include members of the Academic Commission and staff from International Degree Programs.

During the interview, the panel will assess the candidates' motivation, their academic background, and the previous professional experiences. The panel might expand the range of interview topics and request documents confirming the experiences declared in the CV.

The candidates will be selected and ranked by the Academic Commission after the interview. As a result of the interview and after the assessment of additional documents, the Commission reserves the right to revise the ranking in Step 1 and to exclude a candidate if not considered suitable for the program.

In case of ex aequo, internship experiences, curriculum vitae and knowledge of further languages will be considered.

5.2. Selection Procedure for International Business and Business Transformation Programs with Paris Dauphine University and for the Management, Innovation and Sustainability Program with Mannheim

The eligible candidates will be ranked based on their academic performance, which is calculated as follows:

- 50%: Weighted average grade
- 40%: English language (based on CEFR levels)
- 10%: Previous international university mobility experience¹

An Academic Commission will select students based on a non-disputable evaluation.

5.2.1 International experience

This would be the type of experience considered relevant:

- University in-person or virtual mobility program abroad, for at least one semester.
- Having attended a Bachelor's degree out of your home country.
- Internship/traineeship abroad (volunteering experiences are not eligible), for at least 150 hours (certificate required).

Only one international experience will be taken into consideration for the academic performance score purposes. The international experience will be assessed through the following documents:

- Transcript of Records of the exams taken abroad or a certificate issued by the host University concerning the study experience abroad;
- Certificate of internship/traineeship abroad, registered by a University Career Service, demonstrating at least 150 working hours.
- Certificates other than those officially registered by the University Career Service might be submitted to the International Degree Programs, who reserves the right to consider them.

¹The score will be assigned according the following 3 thresholds: 1) No mobility; 2) Less than 3 months; 3) More than 3 months. Virtual mobility programs can be accepted if the student has taken courses equivalent to at least 18 ECTS.



5.2.2 Bachelor's degree and International Secondary School Diploma

To be assigned the corresponding English language level, external applicants are required to attach an official certificate stating that the language of instruction and examination is English. For Luiss students, self-certificates are accepted. Diplomas from International Secondary Schools or Universities that certify courses taken in a bilingual format will not be accepted.

6. Communication of Results

The selection results are considered provisional until selected students:

- comply with the requirements specified in the section 2. 5. of this Call;
- enrol in the required Master's degree and relevant majors in the a.y. 2026/2027 (as per table 1);

Applicants should also be mindful that the final admission into the allocated DD program is also subject to the immigration and enrollment regulations of the host countries and partner universities, and therefore final admission must be confirmed by the partners.

² Luiss students will be notified on their Luiss email accounts only.



7. Acceptance

Selected students are required to confirm their acceptance through written notification within one working day from the communication of results. If a candidate rejects the slot or fails to notify us by the indicated deadline, the next candidate in the waiting list will be recalled. Recalled students will be required to confirm their participation by written notice within one working day.

Any refusal submitted after a candidate has accepted the offer for a slot will be forwarded to the Deputy Rector for Teaching and Quality, who, in collaboration with the Dean of the Graduate School and the Director of Academic Affairs, will assess the justification provided. Refusals deemed inadequately justified will be reported to the Graduation Commission.
