INSTRUCTIONAL GOALS	The present course provides an overview of the key topics concerning business law and risk management and aims at training students to deal with the most important legal and economic issues concerning business and organizations.
INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES	At the end of the course, students will have a first-class knowledge and understanding of the main legal and economic issues concerning business and risk management. Students will also have the ability to analyse complex market scenarios and decide how to employ different marketing strategies.
Pre-requisites	Knowledge of basic legal notions of public and private law is useful for the course learning.

Teaching Methods	Face-to-face teaching and case studies will be complemented by practical exercises (both individual and group works) and seminars with experts and key figures. Interdisciplinary sessions will be organised as well. Students' participation during interactive classes with TA is strongly encouraged.
Assessment	The exam consists of (i) a mid-term written exercise on specific case studies (individual work, 20% of



the final grade), (ii) a project work (group work, 50% on the final grade) and (iii) a final written exam (individual work, 30% of the final grade)

In the midterm exercise, students are required to demonstrate that they have developed a solid comprehension of norms and principles as emerging from the recent debate as well as ability to think critically about possible future developments of extant discussion on the topic dealt within the paper.

The final written exam will be composed of a mix of essay questions on the contents covered in the instructional and other course materials.
