

Call for Applications to Select Exchange Students for 2026/2027 International Programs with European (Erasmus+) and Non-European Countries

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1. Erasmus Charter for Higher Education 2021-2027 (ECHE) / Erasmus+ Program

Luiss Guido Carli has submitted a new application for the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) for 2021-2027 to carry out the exchange and academic training activities provided for by the Erasmus+ Program. The new ECHE has been approved and will be valid from the 2021-2022 to the 2027-2028 academic years.

2. Exchange Agreements

In the context of international university cooperation, Luiss Guido Carli has established **student exchange agreements** with universities in both European (Erasmus+ Program) and non-European countries. These agreements are based on the following principles:

- a. Students who participate in a study period abroad (typically one semester) remain enrolled at their home university and are exempt from paying fees and tuition at the host university.
- b. Exams successfully completed at the host university are recognised as part of the student's **academic curriculum** at their home university.
- c. When each agreement is signed, the number of spots available at each **partner** university is designated for specific academic disciplines (area, degree program, or major) and levels (bachelor's or master's degree), as specified in the relevant call for applications.

3. Eligibility

The selection process is open to:

- Students enrolled in a **bachelor's** degree program who will be in their second year in the 2025-2026 academic year;
- Students enrolled in the **single-cycle master's** degree program in Law who will be in their second, third or fourth years in the 2025-2026 academic year;
- Students enrolled in a **master's** degree program who will be in their first year in the 2025-2026 academic year.

3.1 Compatibility with Other Mobility Programs

The selection process is open to:

- Students applying for any Double Degree, OTEM, LLM Educational Program, or Structured Exchange published in December 2025.
For more information on the list of the above-mentioned programs, refer to the calls for applications published by the International Degree Programs.
Students who apply to both the International Exchange and any of the Double Degree, OTEM, LLM Educational Programs, or Structured Exchanges and are offered and accept a place in one of these programs will automatically be excluded from the call for International Exchanges before.
- Students participating in the Stanford Summer Term program, subject to verification of the academic calendars of the exchange locations to ensure no scheduling conflicts.
- Students who intend to take part in an ENGAGE.EU program—after checking the academic calendars of the partner universities to verify any possible overlaps and after receiving confirmation from the ENGAGE.EU Office (email: engage.eu@luiss.it)—with the exception of the ENGAGE.EU Joint Certificate in Global Sustainability Management program.

The selection process is *not* open to:

- Students enrolled in the second year of any bachelor's degree program who are abroad during the 2025/2026 academic year as part of a Structured Exchange or the Triple Degree programs EU-TriBE and ACE. These students may take part in the selection process during their Master's studies.
- Students enrolled in the first year of a master's degree program in 2025/2026 and participating in mobility during the same academic year (2025/2026).
- Students enrolled in the first year of a master's degree program in the 2025/2026 academic year who were preselected during their third year of the bachelor's program for Double Degree programs with study abroad scheduled for the second year in the 2026/2027 academic year.
- Incoming students enrolled in a Double Degree.
- Students enrolled in the BI-Luiss Joint MSc in Marketing program in the 2025/2026 academic year.
- Students selected for the ENGAGE.EU Joint Certificate in Global Sustainability Management program.

Students should refer to the International Degree Programs Office's Calls for Applications for details, procedures, conditions, and deadlines for each specific call (Double Degrees, Structured Exchanges, and LLMs), available at the following link:

Students may participate in **only one Erasmus+ or bilateral exchange** during each undergraduate or graduate cycle.

Students in the single-cycle master's degree program in Law who have already participated or are currently participating in an international exchange program (Erasmus+ or bilateral exchange) or the "Free Mover Semester" program may apply to participate in this selection only for the remaining spots that cannot be allocated to students who have not yet participated in an international exchange. In this case, their score will also take into account exams taken abroad with results officially recorded by 18 February, 2025.

Students who are participating in the International Exchange program or "Free Mover Semester" during the second semester of the 2026-2027 academic year are not eligible to apply for the 2025-2026 academic year.

3.2 Submission of Applications

Students can submit their applications exclusively through the candidacy form available on their personal webpage, accessed via the Web Self-Service platform:

The application, along with all required attachments, must be submitted online between **January 8 and noon on January 21, 2026**, by accessing the form through the menu: *International Mobility* → *Luiss Outgoing Students*.

The following documentation, scanned in PDF format, must be attached to the application:

- **A copy of a valid ID (passport or national identity card).** Students applying for a bilateral exchange location (excluding Switzerland) or a location in the United Kingdom and Turkey must attach a **passport that does not expire before July 2027**. Only the page showing the picture should be attached. If this is not possible, a valid ID and a receipt of the passport issuance request, or if unavailable, confirmation of an appointment booking must be attached. **Please note:** if selected, a passport will be required during the nomination/application phase at the host university. It is therefore recommended to obtain a valid passport by mid-March, when these procedures will begin.
- Students with *non*-Italian nationality must also attach their **tax code** (health card/tax code certificate).
- **Language certificates** (IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge, etc.) when these are mandatory requirements of the partner universities (it is strongly recommended to carefully read the list of available places and destinations).

- **Any other certificates or attestations proving knowledge of one or more languages** relevant for this selection, meaning languages associated with at least one of the destinations and at a sufficient level. Certificates that are not easily readable will not be considered.
- **A motivation letter** (in Italian or English) addressed to the International Student Mobility Office. This document must be written by the applicant, explaining the motivations behind their application and the reasons for choosing the indicated universities. The choice of language (Italian or English) has no impact on the selection process.

Students may submit only one application, listing **between one and ten preferred locations in order of preference**, chosen from those specified in Annex A of this call for applications.

The locations listed in Annex A are designated for students of specific areas, majors, level, specializations, and/or program years. These limits must be observed; otherwise, the Student Mobility Office will delete the non-compliant location from the application. Some locations may specify additional requirements, such as a minimum grade average or language certifications. Failure to meet these requirements will also result in the deletion of the location(s).

Students should select the host university **based on the compatibility of its academic offerings with their own degree program or major**. This information can be verified on the university's website or through MyLuiss Porta → [Partner Universities](#) (see Chapter **Errore. L'origine riferimento non è stata trovata.** of this call). **Only locations of genuine interest should be indicated**, as students may be assigned their **lowest-preference location**.

Applications will be automatically excluded if found to:

- Be incomplete or contain errors in essential elements;
- Not be submitted via the designated online form in the [student's personal area on Web Self-Service](#);
- Include false documents or statements.

The submission of the application is irrevocable. Once the application has been sent, it can no longer be modified or resubmitted; any withdrawals will be considered as a renunciation of the program and will be handled in accordance with paragraph 5.1 of this call for applications.

Applications from students who are not up to date with tuition fee payments will not be accepted. Luiss University declines all responsibility for the non-receipt of applications due to third-party issues or technical problems. For this reason, it is strongly recommended not to wait until the last day to submit the application.

4. Method of Selection of Candidates

4.1 Criteria of Academic Merit and Language Proficiency

Candidates will be selected based on **academic merit (number of credits and weighted grade average) and language proficiency**. Each candidate's score will be calculated based on academic records maintained by the Student Office as of 18 February, 2026. **It is the candidate's responsibility to ensure that these records are accurate.**

The details are outlined below:

A. Number of Credits

For selection purposes, all credits earned and recorded by **18 February, 2026**, will be considered, provided they are valid toward the degree (including credits from internships, language courses, seminars, soft skills, summer schools, etc.). Credits from additional courses (*corsi liberi*) will not be counted.

The minimum number of credits required varies according to the degree program and year of enrollment.

1. Students enrolled in the **second year of a bachelor's degree program** in the 2025-2026 academic year must meet the following **minimum credit requirements**:
 - Business Administration: **62 credits**
(out of a total of 88 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Economics and Business: **62 credits**
(out of a total of 88 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Economics and Management: **60 credits**
(out of a total of 82 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Global Law: **70 credits**
(out of a total of 100 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Management and Artificial Intelligence: **65 credits**
(out of a total of 92 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Political Science: **62 credits**
(out of a total of 86 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Politics, Philosophy, and Economics: **73 credits**
(out of a total of 102 credits obtainable within the Winter session)

2. Students enrolled in the **second, third, and fourth years of the single-cycle degree program in Law** in the 2025-2026 academic year must meet the following minimum credit requirements:
 - Second Year: **73 credits**
(out of a total of 104 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Third Year: **109 credits**
(out of a total of 155 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Fourth Year: **157 credits**
(out of a total of 223 credits obtainable within the Winter session)

3. Students enrolled in the **first year of a master's degree program** in the 2025-2026 academic year must meet the following **minimum credit requirements**:
 - Amministrazione, Finanza e Controllo: **22 credits**
(out of a total of 34 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Corporate Finance: **21 credits**
(out of a total of 30 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Data Science and Management: **17 credits**
(out of a total of 24 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Economia e Finanza:
 - Applied Economics major: **21 credits**
(out of a total of 30 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Banche e Intermediari Finanziari major: **20 credits**
(out of a total of 28 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Finance” major: **18 credits**
(out of a total of 26 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Global Management and Politics: **21 credits**
(out of a total of 30 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Governo, Amministrazione e Politica: **23 credits**
(out of a total of 32 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - International Relations: **20 credits**
(out of a total of 28 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Management: **21 credits**
(out of a total of 30 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Marketing:
 - Italian track: **26 credits** (out of a total of 36 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - English track: **23 credits** (out of a total of 32 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Policies and Governance in Europe: **21 credits**
(out of a total of 30 credits obtainable within the Winter session)
 - Strategic Management: **23 credits**
(out of a total of 32 credits obtainable within the Winter session)

B. Grade Average:

To be eligible, students must have a **weighted grade average equal to or higher than 26/30** (without rounding). For the purpose of calculating the grade average, all exams taken and recorded by **18 February, 2026**, will be considered.

Please note that some universities require a weighted grade average higher than 26/30, as specified in Annex A of this call for applications.

C. Knowledge of Foreign Languages:

The selection is based on proficiency in the following languages, if associated with at least one preferred destination listed in the application: English, French, Spanish, or German. Candidates must demonstrate knowledge of the language associated with the chosen destination, with a minimum proficiency level of:

- B2 for English.
- B1 for French, Spanish or German.

However, most universities require a higher language proficiency level, sometimes verified by official certification, as specified in Annex A of this call for applications. In some cases, this certification can be substituted with an International Baccalaureate, foreign secondary school diploma, or foreign degree. To clarify their specific situation, students should contact the International Student Mobility Office **as soon as possible, and no later than two weeks before the application deadline, to allow time for verification with the partner university.**

If the chosen location requires a certificate (e.g. TOEFL or IELTS) with a specific minimum score, **the relevant certificate must be attached to the application by the deadline indicated in the call for applications.** These certificates are valid for two years and must be valid at least until September 2026 for students departing in the first semester and until February 2027 for students departing in the second semester. Students who do not yet have the official certificate may attach provisional documents issued by the certification body, provided these clearly show the score obtained, test date, candidate code, and TRF (for IELTS). **Documents showing only registration or test attendance without the obtained score will not be considered.**

If the minimum required language proficiency for one or more of the indicated destinations is not met, or if the specific required official certification is not submitted, the choice of that destination will be automatically cancelled.

Language proficiency can be demonstrated through Luiss language levels, external language certifications, or specially organized language tests, as specified below.

Luiss Language Levels

The levels recorded by the University Language Center **from September 1, 2024**, onward will be considered, including those from previous study cycles. These levels will automatically appear upon application submission, so **no separate certificate is needed**. In some cases, the level shown at the time of application submission may differ from the actual level with which the candidate will participate in the selection. This can occur when the recording of the language exam or qualification takes place after the application has been submitted. In such cases, the actual recorded level will be used.

Levels obtained during the Luiss admission test or from certificates submitted for admission purposes will not be considered.

External Language Certification

All language certificates must be attached to the application **by the deadline**. **Language certificates submitted to Luiss for admission purposes will not be considered for this call for applications.** Only upload certificates for languages relevant to this application that meet the requirements for the chosen locations or that aid in assigning a language level otherwise not recognizable. The admissibility and validity of certifications will be evaluated at the absolute discretion of the International Student Mobility Office and the Student International Relations Academic Commission. The Student Mobility Office and the Commission reserve the right to administer tests to verify students' certified language proficiency levels. If there is a significant discrepancy between the certified level and the student's actual proficiency, disciplinary action will be taken as deemed appropriate.

External language certificates must meet the following requirements:

- **English**

Only the following certificates, including all skills assessed by the respective test and obtained **on or after September 1, 2024**, will be accepted:

- **IELTS**. The [IELTS Online](#), too, will be accepted for assigning a language level and calculating the score; however, it is not guaranteed that this format will be accepted by institutions requiring IELTS certification. (To confirm, please contact the Student Mobility Office well in advance—at least two weeks before the application period opens.) Regardless of the type of IELTS taken, the submitted certificate must always include the TRF (Test Report Form); otherwise, it will be deemed ineligible.
- **TOEFL**
- **Cambridge Certificates**: B2 First, C1 Advanced, C2 Proficiency
- **Duolingo English Test**. In addition to attaching the certificate, **results must also be made public or shared with Luiss through the designated platform**; failure to do so will render the certificate ineligible.

- **Assessment Test** taken at the **Trinity School of Rome**.

Degree certificates from language degree programs that clearly indicate the CEFR language level achieved will also be accepted. Self-certification is not permitted for this purpose.

- **French, Spanish and German**

All certificates must include assessment of all skills covered by the respective test and must be obtained **on or after September 1, 2022**. Accepted certifications include DELE, DELF, DALF, TCF, TFI, and Goethe-Zertifikat.

For students enrolled in a master's degree program, levels obtained during their bachelor's degree at another university will also be considered if the official certification of the European language level is provided by the home university, along with any relevant exam certificates if the language course was part of the degree program. **Self-certifications will not be accepted** as proof of language proficiency.

Other certifications will be evaluated at the sole discretion of the International Student Mobility Office. To confirm the validity of any certificates they wish to submit, students should email the Student Mobility Office (relint@luiss.it) well in advance of the application deadline.

All language certificates must:

- Clearly indicate the candidate's name and personal details;
- Specify the CEFR language level achieved (or provide an equivalence table);
- Include the date of the test (only the test date will be considered, not the certificate issuance date);
- Be printed on official letterhead of the issuing institution, with the institution's stamp or signature.

For students with a Luiss language level that meets the requirements of this call, any external certificate submitted will be considered only if it indicates a higher level than the Luiss level. This higher level will be manually updated by the International Student Mobility Office during the application review process.

Ad Hoc Tests

In the absence of a Luiss level or official certification, applicants **must sit an ad hoc test** organized by Luiss.

Applicants should register for the test when submitting their application by selecting the specific “Sel.” box on the right, next to the test they wish to take.

The test is exclusively available to students for whom the University Language Center does not have a Luiss language level record dating from 1 September, 2024, onward (including levels attained during a bachelor’s degree program).

Attention: Students enrolled in degree programs that require obtaining a Luiss language level (intermediate or final) in time for the application deadline are not eligible to sit these tests. Students who submit a language certification without a Luiss language level recorded may also opt to take the test; in such cases, the test result will replace the level indicated on the attached certification, **whether it is higher or lower.**

The tests will be held in person. Shortly before the test, each candidate will be informed of the classroom where the exam will take place.

The tests will be held on the following dates (dictionaries are not allowed during the test):

- **FRENCH language test**
Monday, 2 February, starting at 8:45 a.m.
- **SPANISH language test**
Monday, 2 February, starting at 12:30 p.m.
- **GERMAN language test**
Tuesday, 3 February, starting at 8:45 a.m.
- **ENGLISH language test**
Tuesday, 3 February, starting at 11:30 a.m.

Students who, in addition to taking these tests, are also scheduled to sit the University Language Center’s tests for language group placement **should only take the tests organized for the Call for International Exchanges.** These tests replace the University Language Center’s tests for group placement, so it is neither necessary nor possible to take both.

Students who took the English test organized by Luiss for Double Degree program applications between December 2025 and January 2026 cannot retake this test. For those students, the level obtained for the Double Degree call will be used.

No simulation or mock tests are available for these exams.

Presumed Language Levels

The following categories of students are considered to have the following presumed language levels:

- Students enrolled in a degree program or major taught in English: third level of proficiency in English: **B2.3-B2.4**.
- Students holding a foreign secondary school diploma or a bachelor's degree taught in a foreign language: **second language bracket (C1)**. To be assigned this level, **an official degree certificate or diploma must be attached** (self-declarations are not accepted) **that explicitly and clearly specifies the language of instruction and the language in which exams were taken—or is issued by an institution that teaches exclusively in a given language**. In the absence of this specification, it will not be possible to recognize the presumed level. Certificates submitted to Luiss for admission purposes will not be considered for this call for applications. Attaching this certificate is not required for English-taught bachelor's degrees obtained at Luiss.

These presumed levels apply only if the University Language Center does not have a record of a different level from 1 September, 2024, onwards (including any level obtained during a bachelor's program) or if a different language level is identified through the language test.

As these are presumed levels, students assigned them may demonstrate a different language level by taking the ad hoc tests mentioned above. In that case, **the test result will replace the presumed level, whether it is lower or higher**. Alternatively, students can attach certification of a higher language level to their application.

No presumed language level will be assigned to “native speakers” or to those holding foreign citizenship. These students **must demonstrate their language proficiency** using one of the methods mentioned above.

4.2 Compilation of the Ranking Lists

The four ranking lists, one for each area of study, will be generated by an automated computer system and compiled based on academic merit and language proficiency as explained above, taking into account the order of preference for the locations indicated by the students.

Each candidate will receive a score that determines their place on the ranking list, arranged in descending order. This score is calculated using the following formula:

{Weighted grade average + internship credits/8 + [(credits earned / total obtainable credits) * 15]} * (1 + 0.01 * language adjustment coefficient).

Please note that the ratio between earned credits and obtainable credits may exceed 1 in the case of surplus credits resulting from early recognition of courses, other activities, etc.

NB Credits earned through internships are not counted among either earned or obtainable credits. They are added directly to the weighted average at a rate of one-eighth (1/8) of their total.

The language adjustment coefficient is calculated as follows:

Only the languages associated with the candidate's chosen destination preferences are considered, in decreasing order of priority.

Example: if a candidate selects **the first three destinations in Spanish**, the **4th and 5th in English**, and the **last two in French**, and attaches the corresponding valid language certificates for score calculation, then **their first language will be Spanish, the second English, and the third French**. Conversely, if the candidate selects destinations associated only with English but attaches valid certifications for a second or third language, these will not affect the coefficient in any way.

Please note: At least half of the courses taken at the host university must be in the language associated with the chosen location.

The maximum language coefficient is 20 points, distributed according to the candidate's language skills as follows:

1st language: up to 12 points

2nd language: up to 6 points

3rd language: up to 2 points

Each language is subdivided into proficiency bands, determining the portion of the bonus points the candidate is eligible for.

The coefficient is determined by summing the percentages of the bonus points obtained for the first language and, if applicable, the second and third languages. The specific language bonus values for each language level are provided in the tables on pages 25 and 26 of this call for applications.

In the event of a tied score, the Student International Relations Academic Commission will consider the following factors in order of importance: **the level of proficiency in the foreign language associated with the first selected location, the number of grades of cum laude** (only within the same study cycle), **the weighted grade average without decimal points, and the cover letter**. For students enrolled in a master's degree program, the bachelor's degree grade will be considered before the foreign language proficiency level.

In compliance with current personal data protection laws, it will not be possible to publish the rankings. Placement results will be available on the web self-service platform **around mid-March**, at the conclusion of the selection process. A notice will be posted on the website, and the selection outcome will also be communicated to all candidates via email.

Applications will be evaluated at the absolute discretion of the Student International Relations Academic Commission, composed of Professors Cinzia Calluso, Alessia Caponera, Francesco Cherubini, Fabrizio Core, Lucia Pierini, and Pietro Pustorino.

4.3 Students with Disabilities

Students with disabilities are encouraged to apply for the mobility program covered by this call for applications. The International Student Mobility Office will make every effort to ensure that their experience is fully satisfying. To identify appropriately equipped locations, a prior assessment of the type of disability and necessary compensatory measures will be conducted.

Taking academic merit and language requirements into consideration, the Student International Relations Commission reserves the right to allocate one or more places to **candidates with certified severe disabilities** if it determines that the disability can be satisfactorily managed only by a specific institution.

It is therefore strongly recommended that these students contact the office staff promptly and provide all necessary documentation at least three weeks before the application deadline, to allow sufficient



time for proper evaluation. After this period, these students may still submit their application, but it will be more difficult to ensure them an adequate experience, and no placements will be reserved.

After selection for an Erasmus+ location through the international exchange call, students with disabilities may check with the International Student Mobility Office about the possibility of receiving financial aid for special needs. Any aid granted will be based exclusively on actual costs incurred abroad.

5. Procedures after the Assignment of a Location

Selected students are required to read all communications sent to their institutional e-mail address with the utmost attention and to strictly comply with the provisions of the **Regulations for Outgoing Students a.y. 2026–2027**.

5.1 Withdrawal from the Assigned Location

By submitting their application under this call for applications, students commit to participating in and completing the exchange program if they are assigned any of the locations they requested.

Under no circumstances will it be possible to exchange an assigned location with another student.

Exceptional withdrawals must be promptly communicated to the International Student Mobility Office by completing the appropriate form (available at the following link: <https://forms.office.com/e/iBdn2STsfZ>), specifying the reason and attaching any supporting documentation. Withdrawals not submitted through the appropriate form will be considered unjustified.

A withdrawal submitted at any time will be reported to the Deputy Rector for Teaching of the relevant School, who will evaluate the reason provided. If the reason is deemed inadequate, **the withdrawal will be reported to the President of the Graduation Examination Committee**, as it may affect the evaluation of the student's overall academic record.

Withdrawing from the assigned location implies forfeiting participation in the exchange program for the 2026-2027 academic year and is irrevocable.

5.2 Reassignment from Waiting Lists

Students who, despite meeting the requirements outlined in this call for applications, are not allocated a location due to demand exceeding availability will be placed on a waiting list.

Vacancies for a location that arise due to *exceptional* withdrawals will be filled by candidates on the waiting list for that location, selected based on their position on the relevant ranking list and **compatible with the deadlines and procedures of the partner university** (which may sometimes prevent certain vacancies from being filled). Students on the waiting list who are allocated a location will need to accept or decline it promptly. If written acceptance does not reach the International Student Mobility Office by email at relint@luiss.it by the specified deadline, the student will automatically forfeit the place, and the next candidate on the waiting list will be contacted.

Residual vacancies for locations with no waiting list may be filled by students from other areas who have applied for that host university, in accordance with the relevant exchange agreement.

Note: Withdrawals are processed in the order they are received.

5.3 Choice of Semester for Studying Abroad

Unless explicitly indicated, **the duration of the exchange is one semester**, typically taking place during the first semester. **Only students in the single-cycle degree program in Law, and not for all host universities, may choose either semester**, depending on the academic offerings of the partner university, by completing a designated form **within three days of the publication of selection results**. If this communication is not submitted by the deadline, the first semester will automatically be assigned as the exchange period. Students assigned to a location for which the semester is already specified in Annex A are not required to fill out the form.

Requests to extend the duration of the mobility period will not be accepted.

Students are required to adhere to the arrival dates set by the academic calendars of their host universities. This means that, in most cases, it will not be possible to sit exams at Luiss during the mobility period.

5.4 Preparation for Departure and General Meeting

In mid-March 2026 (the exact date and time will be communicated via email), **a general online meeting will be held, to which all students admitted to the program will be invited to participate**. During the meeting, the various steps required to prepare for departure will be explained. Regardless of participation in the meeting, all students are required to carefully read the program regulations and all documentation available [online](#).

5.5 Study Abroad Plan

At the same time as the publication of the selection results, information will be provided regarding the process for finalizing the study abroad plans (Learning Agreements) and associated academic recognition. This is expected to take place between the end of March and mid-June 2026, with specific deadlines depending on the chosen locations.

Students are solely responsible for preparing their course recognition proposals to be submitted to their respective Academic Coordinator. Students must also complete all application formalities required by the host universities by the specified deadlines.

Failure to comply with the required procedures and deadlines may result in exclusion from the exchange program.

5.6 Minimum Requirement for Participation in an Exchange Program

Participation in the exchange program requires that students attend courses at the partner university recognized with least two Luiss courses, excluding any additional course (*corso libero*) or language course. Students whose study plan does not meet this requirement will be excluded from the exchange program.

5.7 Acceptance by the Host University

After the publication of the ranking lists and assignment of locations, **formal acceptance of each student remains at the discretion of the host university.** Non-acceptance by the partner university does not entitle the student to automatic reassignment to another location.

5.8 Recognition of Exams Taken Abroad

Upon completion of the study period abroad and receipt of certification for the exams taken abroad (i.e., *the transcript of records*), which will be reviewed by the Head of the International Student Mobility Office for content and accuracy, the courses completed abroad will be recognized in the student's academic record based on the Learning Agreement and the Regulations for Outgoing Students. The grades obtained abroad will be converted to a scale of thirtieths according to specific conversion tables approved by the Student International Relations Academic Commission. **These conversion tables, as well as the conversion itself, are final and not subject to appeal.** Furthermore, in line with the new educational models of the Schools, **it will not be possible to submit a request to waive grades obtained abroad.**

The entire recognition process requires approximately 5 weeks from the time the *final transcript of records* is received.

Please note that, in most cases, the transcript of records is received between March and May (for some locations, particularly the **United Kingdom**, it may not arrive until **July or even September**).

Consequently, **updating the student's academic record with exams taken during the exchange period may not occur in time for early graduation in the extraordinary March/April session or for applications to another university.**

Early graduation will only be possible if the International Student Mobility Office receives the student's official and final transcript of records **by 15 January.**

5.9 Accommodation Abroad

Although most partner universities offer support in finding accommodation, securing suitable housing that meets individual needs **is ultimately the responsibility of each student.** It is advisable to begin the search as early as possible to maximize chances of success. Be cautious of scams, especially in private markets and outside institutional channels, where risks are always present.

6. Financial Terms

Students participating in an exchange program are required to pay tuition fees to Luiss and are **exempt from paying tuition fees at the partner university**. Students are responsible for expenses related to travel, meals, accommodation, any additional insurance beyond that provided by Luiss, visa, and any administrative fees.

If funding is confirmed, all students assigned an exchange placement will receive financial support, generally intended to cover travel expenses and the higher cost of living abroad. The amount and disbursement method of this funding will depend on the type of exchange (Erasmus+/bilateral exchange/Switzerland).

- **For exchanges carried out under the European Erasmus+ program**, a financial grant funded by the European Union is provided. The monthly amount is determined by the Erasmus National Agency based on the cost of living in the host country. Given the steady increase in the number of students participating in mobility programs, it may not be possible to guarantee a scholarship for the full duration of the exchange. Confirmation of funding and determination of the amount allocated to each student generally take place by the summer.
- **For participants in a bilateral exchange**, scholarships—if funding is confirmed—will be financed by Luiss, and the amount will be the same for all students, regardless of destination or study period.
- **Students assigned to a university in Switzerland** will participate in the [Swiss European Mobility Programme \(SEMP\)](#). Any grants provided by the Swiss Federal Government will be announced by the host universities to all eligible students.
- **United Kingdom placements:** The United Kingdom is considered a **partner country** rather than a full member of the Erasmus+ program. Therefore, Erasmus+ grants for the UK will only be awarded if the funding received from the European Commission is sufficient. Otherwise, the grants will be financed by Luiss funds, in the same way as bilateral scholarships, if such funding is confirmed.

Additional funding may be available through the Ministry of Universities and Research (MUR) to support international student mobility. If this funding is confirmed, students will need to apply according to instructions that will be communicated via email to those selected for an exchange. The top-up grant amount, unless otherwise specified by the MUR, will be means-tested (based on an “ISEE Università” form, to be submitted approximately between May and June 2025) and will depend on the exchange duration.

7. My Luiss – Partner Universities

Documentation for the universities listed in Annex A to this call for applications can be found on the partner universities' websites and can also be accessed through MyLuiss portal in the '**Partner Universities**' section at the following link: <https://my.luiss.it/course/index.php?categoryid=1098>.

The portal also provides student-prepared reports from each location, information on recognized courses, and other useful details, such as the number of requests received for each location in the call for international mobilities for the 2025-2026 academic year.

Please note that Luiss is not responsible for the information contained in the FAQs and fact sheets of the partner universities, and all published information is subject to change.

NB In some cases, requirements for studying at a particular location are determined by the immigration policies of the host country. For example, the United Kingdom may require specific types of English certification if particular visa types are needed. **Candidates should carefully verify whether such specific requirements apply in the countries of their interest.**

Non-Italian students may not be eligible for admission to universities in their country of citizenship. These students are therefore advised to contact the International Student Mobility Office well in advance of the application deadline to verify their eligibility.

Student mobility programs are based on cooperation between the involved universities, in accordance with the terms of the relevant agreements, which may be updated periodically. The information published in Annex A regarding the requirements for studying at exchange locations is the result of negotiations aimed at facilitating access for Luiss students (for example, while many locations technically require external language certification, in many cases the Office can secure an exemption through certification by the University Language Center).

While every effort is made to publish accurate information, Luiss is not responsible for any changes resulting from circumstances beyond its direct control.

8. International Student Mobility Office – Opening Hours for Students

The office is open for in-person meetings Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. The office is located on the ground floor of Villa de Heritz at the Viale Romania Campus.

Applications may only be filled out and submitted [online](#) from **Thursday, 8 January to Wednesday, 21 January, 2026**, by noon.

Note: Once the deadline has passed, the system for receiving applications will shut down, and it will no longer be possible to apply.

Please note that **any withdrawals from the program will be handled in accordance with Article 5.1 of this call for applications. It is therefore essential to carefully assess your genuine interest in participating and to select the universities to include in your application with attention to the following:**

- Consider the compatibility of the academic offerings at the exchange location.
- Take into account the language proficiency levels required by the universities of interest.
- Verify your own CEFR language proficiency levels.
- Check the validity of your language certifications.
- Review the documentation and websites of the partner universities.
- Prepare scans of the required mandatory attachments.

Accessing the Online Application Process

Attention: the system may go into standby mode and redirect the applicant to the homepage if too much time is taken to complete the form.

- Log into your Web Self-Service, select the “Study Abroad” menu item, click on “Study abroad opportunities (Luiss Outgoing Students),” and then click on the magnifying glass under “Azioni.”
- Select your area of study (*Impresa e Management*, *Economia e Finanza*, *Scienze Politiche*, or *Giurisprudenza*).
Note: Students enrolled in Corporate Finance should select the *Impresa e Management* area, and those in Global Management and Politics should select *Scienze Politiche*. To do this, click on the magnifying glass under “Azioni.”
- Click on “Fill out the form.”
- Select up to 10 locations in order of preference using the priority selector in the “Pref.” drop-down menu.
- Choose the language for each selected location.

- If language data is available, it will be pre-filled. If not, select your level from the drop-down menu and check the “Certification” box (you will need to attach the certification at a later stage). Alternatively, leave the field blank and enroll in the language test by checking the “Select to enroll” box on the right.
- On the next page, upload all required attachments (PDF format only) by clicking on “Upload attachments”:
 - a. *Documento d’identità*

A copy of a valid ID (passport or national identity card). Students applying for a bilateral exchange location (excluding Switzerland) or in the United Kingdom and Turkey must attach a passport valid until at least July 2027, **with only the biodata and photo page included**. If a passport is not available, a valid ID along with proof of passport application or confirmation of a booked appointment may be submitted. Students with foreign nationality must also attach their tax code (health card/tax code certificate).
 - b. *Certificato o attestato di lingua*
 - **Language certificates** (IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge, etc.), when these are mandatory requirements set by the partner universities (it is recommended to carefully read the list of available destinations and placements).
 - **Any other attestations/certificates demonstrating proficiency in one or more languages** relevant to this selection process, provided they correspond to languages associated with at least one destination and reflect an adequate proficiency level. Certificates that are not clearly legible will not be considered.
 - c. *Lettera di motivazione*

A motivation letter (in Italian or English) addressed to the International Student Mobility Office. This document must be written freely and independently by the applicant, expressing the reasons for applying. The choice of language used has no impact on the selection process.
- Once you have reviewed your application, click on “Confirmation of application and final printing.”

Important: After submitting the application and printing the receipt, it will no longer be possible to amend or resubmit the application!

Students are advised to save their confirmation of enrolment. No confirmation email will be sent.

Tips for Filling Out the Online Application Form

Follow these simple recommendations to avoid issues while completing the online application form for the Call for Applications for International Exchanges 2026-2027.

- Do *not* use a **smartphone** or **tablet** to fill out the application form.
- Ensure that all **attachments** are **in PDF format**; otherwise, the system will not upload them.
- Keep file sizes of attachments manageable to avoid upload issues. You can **adjust your scanner** or acquisition software settings to a resolution of 150dpi and an appropriate image size. If you experience difficulties, seek help from an expert or visit a photocopying center.

If you encounter difficulties filling out the application despite following this guide, assistance is available during office hours—**provided you reach out before the application deadline** (21 January, 2026, at noon). Alternatively, you can contact us by phone at +39 06 8522 5642.

Please Note: Given the high volume of assistance requests, especially close to the deadline, we may not be able to process them all. **It is therefore advisable not to wait until the last moment to submit your application**, so that you have the possibility to receive support if needed.

Annex A – 2026-2027 Places and Destinations

Call for Applications to Select Exchange Students for 2026/2027 International Programs with European (Erasmus+) and Non-European Countries

The program year refers to the year in which students are enrolled during the 2025-2026 academic year (i.e., at the time of application submission). For example, “bachelor’s” means that only students enrolled in the second year of a bachelor’s degree program in the 2025-2026 academic year may apply for the location in question.

Any withdrawals from the program will be handled in accordance with Article 5.1 of this call for applications. It is therefore **essential to carefully assess your genuine interest in participating and to select universities thoughtfully**, considering the compatibility of each university’s academic offerings with your degree program or major. Indicate only locations of genuine interest, keeping in mind that you could ultimately be assigned your lowest-choice location.

For students enrolled in the single-cycle master’s degree program in Law who have already taken part in an international exchange, it may be somewhat more challenging to find compulsory courses that can be recognized. Students are therefore advised to pay particular attention when selecting their preferred destination universities.

For universities offering courses in two languages—for example, “English or French”—**students must select only one language**, in which they will be required to take at least 50% of their courses abroad. The chosen language and the corresponding proficiency level must be indicated in the application form.

Some universities require specific language levels and/or mandatory certifications, as specified in the call for applications.

To see how the language levels required by universities compare to the CEFR and various official certificates, refer to the table on page 2524 of this document.

Some locations may not offer courses compatible with Luiss compulsory courses. In such cases, students may obtain academic recognition for elective courses (courses included in the curriculum and required for graduation) **or for additional courses** (supernumerary courses that students can add to their curriculum to enrich it; if taken abroad, the grades do not contribute to the calculation of the GPA).

In some partner universities (especially in Spain, the United Kingdom, and many non-European countries), students do not have access to master's or graduate-level courses or their equivalent. Students can verify this by browsing the university websites, reviewing partner university surveys on the Luiss Intranet portal, or consulting Student Mobility Office staff.

Timeline for Issuing Transcripts of Records

Please note that for some locations (e.g., University of Durham [full-year exchange], University of Leeds, Swansea University, University of Nottingham – Ningbo, University of Aston), transcripts of records for the first semester are typically received between July and September, making graduation in the summer session impossible. For students studying abroad in the second semester, the delayed receipt of transcripts will often make summer graduation impossible; in some cases, graduation in the autumn session may also be unfeasible (e.g., Waseda University).
