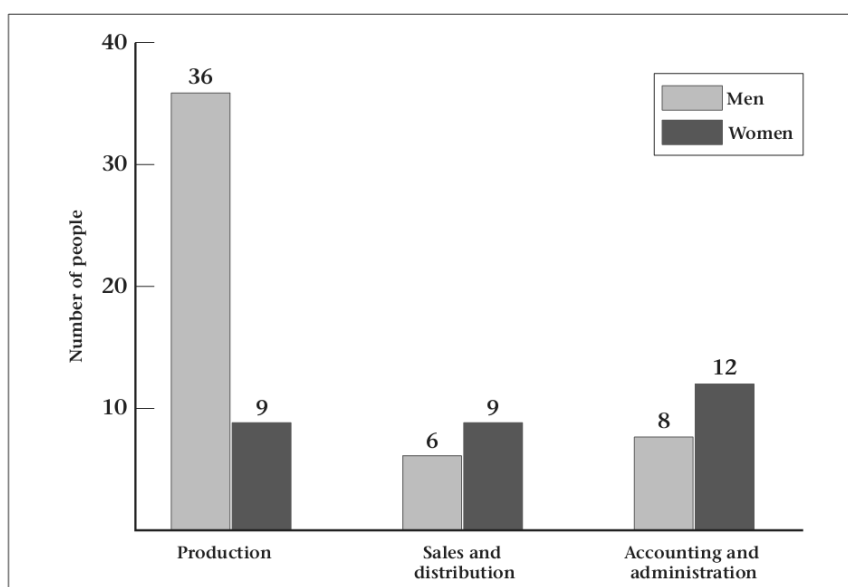
Now study example **E1** and, bearing the passage in mind, decide which of the statements is correct:

The correct answer is “international competition has an impact on the need for businesses to restructure more frequently than in the past” (second statement). To give the correct answer you should therefore **click on the circle** next to this answer.

Example **E2** presents a histogram showing the number of men and women who work in the three departments of the Rossi & C. company.



E2. What is the percentage of women who work at Rossi & C.?

To find the percentage of women who work at Rossi & C., you need to calculate how many people in total work at the company ($36 + 9 + 6 + 8 + 9 + 12 = 80$). Then, calculate how many of these people are women ($9 + 9 + 12 = 30$). With this data, it is now possible to calculate the percentage $[(30/80) \times 100]$, which is equal to 37.5% (fourth option). To give the correct answer you should therefore **click on the circle** next to this answer.

In example **E3**, the question regards two people, Massimo and Laura. First of all, a situation that Massimo or Laura believe to be true will be presented. This will be followed by some information (in *italic*), which you will need to study carefully. You need to establish what effect the new information may have, if indeed it has any effect at all, on the beliefs of Massimo or Laura.

Look at the example **E3**:

E3. Laura believes that when the lift arrives on her floor, it will beep twice.

Every time the lift opens on Laura's floor without beeping at all.

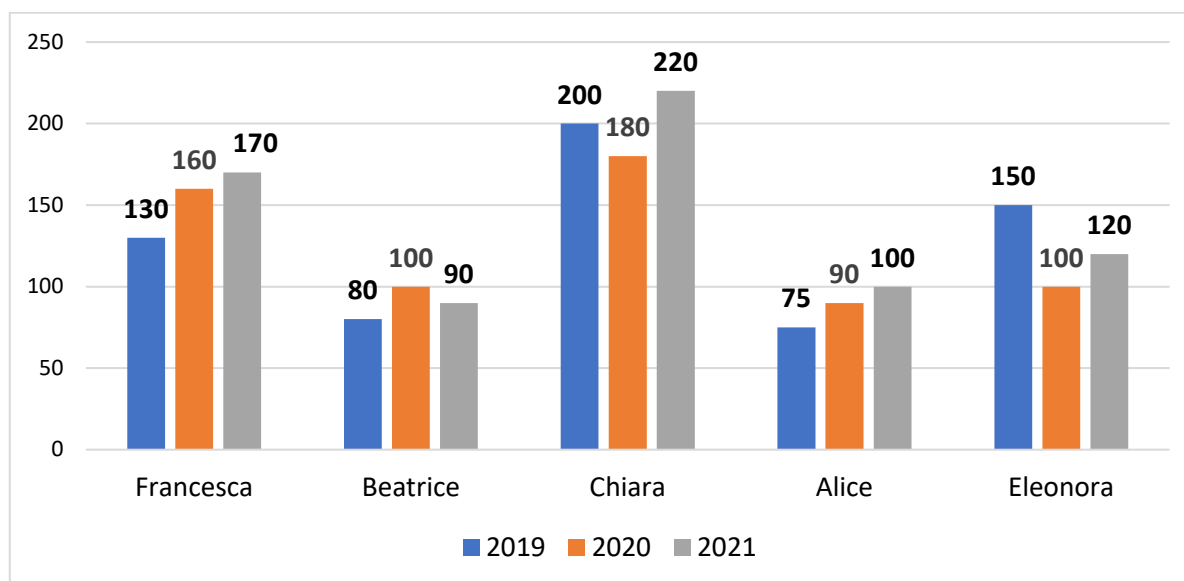

Cooking eggs is scientifically interesting. Why does the yolk of hard-boiled eggs no longer sits in the centre of the white like when the eggs are raw? Because of Archimedes' principle: a body immersed in a fluid is buoyed up by a force equal to the weight-force of the displaced volume of liquid. Therefore, as egg yolks (made up of 55% water, 27% fat, and 15% protein) are denser than egg whites (87% water, 11% protein), they float in them, and during cooking they are drawn upwards according to Archimedes' principle. If, on the other hand, a raw egg is broken in a container, the yolk does not float on the surface, nor does it sink, but remains more or less in the centre of the albumen. The explanation is in the structure of the egg. The yolk is wrapped in a film (vitelline membrane) and is joined to the inner membrane of the shell (which surrounds the albumen) by two filaments, the chalazas. These filaments act as safety belts, keeping the germinal disc in the centre of the egg, a small dot on the surface of the yolk from which the chick will hatch, so that it is always surrounded by the white, which will nourish the embryo during its development.

In the eastern part of the island of Rügen, in Germany, there is a tourist location that attracts many visitors, but has a very different history from that of many others: in fact, it hosts the so-called Colossus of Prora, a former summer camp built by the Nazis in the 1930s. The recent transformation of the building into a hotel and tourist apartments has raised criticisms and observations related to its past. It was conceived by the Nazis to accommodate up to 20,000 people during the mass summer holidays and to become the longest building in the world: a series of six-story buildings very similar to each other, attached to one another, which measured 4.5 kilometres in total. 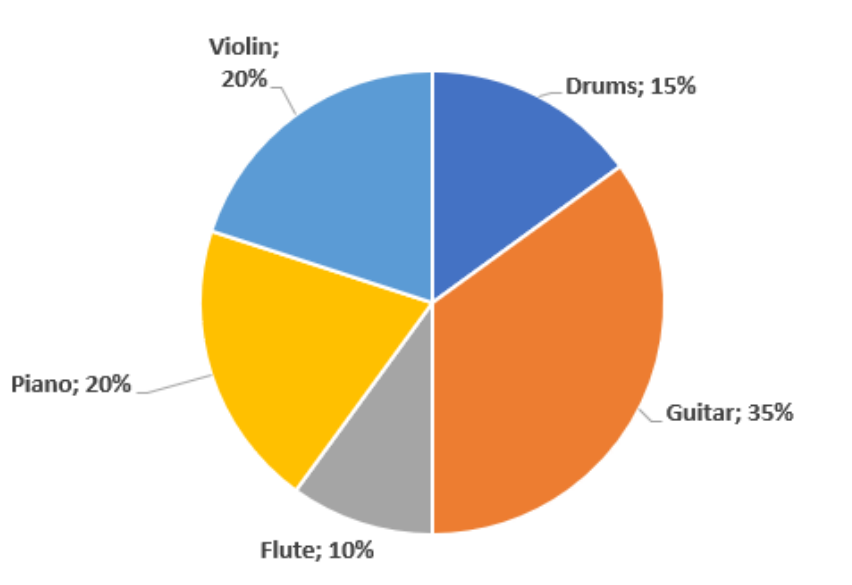
